

Wide ranging document with £160m of projects spanning youth support to banning Nitrous Oxide




Action plan was launched on 27 March 2023

Headline policies

- Pathfinders of hotspot response and immediate justice in 23/24 ahead of national rollout in 24/25
- Greater fines for fly-tipping, littering and graffiti
- Renters reform bill will make it easier for private landlords to take actions against ASB from tenants
- Reviving high streets including powers to make occupiers and owners tidy up their buildings
- Restoration of green parks and open spaces
- Greater surveying to understand experience of ASB
- Programmes targeting young people and families most at risk of turning to crime and antisocial behaviour

The action plan specifically commits to:

- work with police, local authorities courts and • housing providers to improve overall quality of local data
- a digital one-stop-shop where people can • report anti-social behaviour to the right local responders and get feedback on the

response.







Other commitments include:

- Setting clear expectations that social landlords' • existing powers of allocation and eviction are exercised in a timely fashion
- Updating social housing allocations guidance to be • clear that evidence of committing anti-social behaviour should be used to de-prioritise anti-social behaviour perpetrators
- Exploring a "three strikes and you're out" eviction expectation for all social landlords
